



ELIGIBLE USE OF FUNDS

Funding for new projects/programs

INELIGIBLE USE OF FUNDS

Expenses incurred prior to the contract date

Facilities, equipment, staff, programming, or other expenses used for political purposes, lobbying, or to engage in other partisan political activities

Non-secular programming

Funding that exceeds 50% of your organization's total annual budget


